IN-PERSON LEARNING

MONDAY-THURSDAY

8:00-3:10

**** Friday, August 21st will be an in-person instructional day for students from 8:00-1:00pm (Early Dismissal)**

General In-Person information:

- Socially distanced classrooms, as possible
- Preventative measures taken to attempt to keep supplies with only one student
- All students **MUST** wear masks for in-person schooling except for instances where:
 - Students are outside and can social distance
 - Students are eating or drinking and are social distanced
- Typical instructional practices to take place
- Social distancing, as possible, will be adhered to in all classrooms. It is to be noted that in some classrooms students will have less than six feet between themselves. Also, social distancing will not be able to be accomplished on a school bus.
- Parents will be self-certifying their child(s) health before getting on the bus or coming to school
- Students will be utilizing Google Classroom as the main platform for learning
- As a practice, during the period of blended remote learning, whole group classroom instruction may be recorded or live streamed by teachers and made available for students utilizing remote learning
- Live streaming will be available for students that are learning remotely
- The recorded lessons should not be shared nor should the live streams be recorded without the permission of the teacher or school district
- Students will not share supplies, as possible
- Locker Rooms may not be available for students during the traditional school day
- Signage will be posted throughout all buildings to help remind students of appropriate social distancing and hygienic behavior
- The district will be in continuous contact with the Stephenson County Health Department for guidance and reporting purposes

BUS RULES

- Students need to wear a mask at all times on the bus
- Parents/Guardians will self-certify their student before getting on the bus
- Buses will be cleaned after each route
- Assigned seats will be given to students. We will try to limit one child per seat or one family to a seat to every extent possible

ARRIVAL/BREAKFAST

- Students will not be allowed in the building before 7:45am. When waiting outside students will need to practice social distancing and wear a mask
- Students will not be allowed to “hangout” in the hallways
- JH/HS students will enter at the IMC JH doors only at 7:45am
 - JH/HS will either grab a breakfast and take it to their first hour or go directly to their first hour class
- 5th and 6th grade will enter through the main school Doors at 7:50am
 - Students will enter and go either directly to cafeteria to eat or go directly to homeroom
- 3rd and 4th grade students will enter through the back parking lot small gym lobby doors at 7:55am
 - Students will enter and go either directly to cafeteria to eat or go directly to homeroom
- 1st and 2nd grade will enter through the back parking lot top of the parking lot door area at 7:50am
 - Students will enter and go either directly to cafeteria to eat or go directly to homeroom
- PreK-K will enter through the door by the flagpole at 7:45am
 - Students will enter and go either directly to cafeteria to eat or go directly to homeroom

** We will limit the number of students eating breakfast in the cafeteria to 50 students or less

** Elementary students will eat breakfast in the cafeteria. JH/HS students will eat in their first hour class

HALLWAY LOCKERS and PASSING PERIODS

- JH/HS students will be released in an organized manner to their hallway locker by their first hour teacher
- Students will not be allowed to go to their lockers in between their classes
- JH/HS students should report directly to their next period class
- JH/HS Students may use restrooms between class periods but must adhere to capacity limits
- Elementary students will be dismissed to go to their lockers by their homeroom teachers

BATHROOM BREAKS/WATER FOUNTAINS

- Bathrooms will be limited to the number of toilets in the room. Students may need to wait in the hallway until a stall is made available
- Students will only be allowed out of their class one at a time, unless of an emergency
- Restrooms will be closed periodically during the day for extra cleaning
- Water fountains will be shut off unless it is a bottle fill fountain.

LUNCH

- K-5 will be eating in their homerooms or designated areas
 - Students will only receive one choice as their main meal for lunch
 - Students may bring their own lunch from home, but not share with anyone else
- JH/HS will be eating lunch in the Cafeteria
 - The Cafeteria will be set up to fit 50 students. Overflow of students will go to another designated area
 - Students will only receive one choice as their main meal for lunch
 - Students may bring their own lunch to school
- Lunches will be distributed to students on disposable trays and use disposable utensils.

PE

- Elementary PE will be held in the Elementary Gym at their designated times
 - Students will need to still wear masks for PE if inside
 - Students may remove masks if outside and adhering to social distancing
- JH/HS students will still change for PE
 - Students will have staggered changing times
 - Student lockers will be spread out to every extent possible
 - Students may remove masks if outside and adhering to social distancing

BAND AND CHORUS

- Elementary chorus will take place in the homeroom classrooms or outside when nice. Masks will need to be worn during class
- JH/HS Choir will meet in Choir room, Cafeteria or outside and masks will be required
- Band will also meet in the Band room and will be socially distanced when possible. Band will also meet outside in in larger spaces when available

OUTSIDE MASK BREAKS

- Teachers will plan outside mask breaks throughout the day at different outside areas
 - We have several tents for outside, Lions Park, Courtyard, outside buildings

DISMISSAL TO BUSES

- Students will be dismissed by their teacher at designated times and doorways

2:55 Pre-K, K and 1st grade– Para’s, please sit with your child until the JH/HS loads the bus.

3:00 2nd - 3rd grade Dismissal

3:05 4th – 6th grade Dismissal

3:05 9th – 12th grade Study Hall Dismissal- walk out the JH doors

3:10 7th - 8th and HS Elective Class Dismissal - walk out the JH doors

*3:15 All busses depart

- Parents can still pick up their student as they have done in past years. However, will not be allowed in the building

EVERY FRIDAY REMOTE LEARNING

Within this solution Friday Remote Learning would look like:

- **No students will be at the school on Fridays. All Students will be remote learning (*****Exception is August 21st will be an in-person instruction day from 8:00-1:00**)**
- Teacher available 8:30-1:30 through their school email. Teachers will not be available at school
- No new learning- Review, ask questions, preview
- Students will be required to log in and log out at specific times to record attendance
- Students will need to log in to Google Classroom to check for information and also to contact teachers
- Teacher time on Friday to create lessons for next week
- Teachers will be monitoring student work for those that are absent due to illness
- Limited access for staff to the building will be allowed on Friday Cleaning Days
- No students will be allowed in the school building

STUDENTS THAT HAVE CHOSEN TO OPT-IN TO REMOTE LEARNING

STUDENTS THAT HAVE OPTED-IN FOR REMOTE LEARNING WILL NEED TO PICK UP THEIR SCHOOL MATERIALS (BOOKS AND TECHNOLOGY) ON August 20th from 1:00pm to 4:00pm. Limit to one person entering the building

REMOTE LEARNERS NEED TO BE PREPARED TO LOG INTO THEIR CLASSES ON AUGUST 21ST

Learning/Communication Platforms

- In an effort to provide consistency and clarity, Google Classroom will be used as the learning and communication management platform for all students K-12.
- Faculty and staff will also be available through their Pearl City email address.
- Students need to use their chromebook devices and log into their Google Classroom accounts. If you do not remember your account contact the district office or your teacher

Delivery of Content

- Students will be provided with structured schedules
 - JH/HS students will need to follow their regular scheduled day
 - Elementary students will also follow instructional day and will be given further guidance by their teacher
- Structured and scheduled engagement in academics
- At times remote students may join a Google Meet or other directly synchronous activity
- At other times remote students may engage more independently during a class period based on what the teacher has planned for that day
- Scheduled Google Meets conferencing with classes with firm expectations
- Live streaming will be available for students that are learning remotely
- New curriculum will continue to be covered

- Streamed or recorded lessons from teachers to facilitate new learning
- Attendance based on being visually present or completing assignments/assessments. There will be an attendance form to complete either daily or by class

Grading/Academic Expectations:

- Students will be required to be present and attendance will be recorded through Google classroom
- Students will be expected to complete assignments and assessments by assigned due dates
- Some assignments may need to be physically returned through mail or by dropping it off at the school office
- Grading and feedback on assignments and assessments will be the same/similar to general grading practices and in-person grading practices

Student Supports:

- General "office hours" of availability for faculty and staff
- Social-emotional supports from school counselors, social workers, staff members, and administrators will be available to support students via digital mediums

Student Device and Access

- All 2nd-12th grade students who are in Remote Learning will be required to utilize district provided devices. PreK-1st grade students will receive information from their teacher
- Students will be monitored for safety and internet protocols
- Families will need to provide access to the Internet for their students

Food Distribution

- Parents and students that would like to have a school meal can come and pick up a lunch from the school cafeteria at specific times and location to be determined at a later date

It is important to reiterate that any student opting for Remote Learning SHALL remain in Remote Learning until the conclusion of the first quarter. A student's progress will be evaluated at mid-term to see if a change may be recommended by the school district. A deadline for notification to move from Remote to In-Person at the conclusion of the first quarter will be announced at a later date.
