To provide our kids with the best education, we must also prepare them for the future by providing and teaching them with research-based teaching strategies, rigorous standards, and the best possible tools to go out in the world and be successful. The vision statement for the Pearl City School District is to promote educational excellence in a positive environment to inspire life-long learning and responsible citizenship. Below are a few ways that we are doing this in the Pearl City School District

Curriculum

This year the district is implementing a new Science Curriculum K-12, Agriculture curriculum and Foreign Language curriculum. The mentioned curriculums are researched based curriculums that are centered around creative thinking, hands on material, and digital material in order to stay up-to-date with all of the changes. The teachers also have taken part in professional development to implement the new programs. The district is looking to improve and update the Fine Arts curriculum for the 2023-2024 school year. This is all aligned with our four-year curriculum timeline. The district will have updated curriculum in all areas after the 2024 school year. The district will then set up committees to continue to review the curriculums. We want to continue to provide our students with the most updated ways of learning to increase their success in whatever they choose to do in the future.

School Messenger- Pearl City School District is utilizing the School Messenger automated notification system for families, parents, and/or guardians of children attending Pearl City Elementary School, Pearl City Jr/Sr. High School, Pearl City PASS Program, and Pearl City Daycare Center. School Messenger allows the Superintendent to record a brief message, which can be sent to parents simultaneously. Once the message is recorded, it only takes a few minutes to distribute. The system can be used if school is canceled for the day or if school is dismissed early. If you have any questions concerning the School Messenger emergency notification system or would like a different contact number to be called, please contact your child's building office administrator or administrative assistant.

Building and Grounds

The district is looking to complete two construction projects in the summer of 2023 or 2024. The district is first looking to update the HVAC in the High School hallway. The second project that the district is looking to do is build a Greenhouse for the Agriculture and Science programs. Both of these projects will be mostly funded by a federal and state grant.

Finances- The district is proud to let the parents and community know that this year the district has a balanced budget. This is an important step for the school district and the community. However, we also need to be aware of the financial mandates that are being added to the school districts in the coming years. Even with financial concerns, the district has continued to move forward by enhancing educational opportunities in the classrooms. We will continue to provide the best educational opportunities for the students with the funding we receive. **School Board Election-** There are three (four-year term) seats available on the Pearl City School District School Board for anyone interested in running for a position as a school board member in the April 4th 2023 election. Interested candidates may pick up a packet at the Stephenson County Clerk's office in Freeport. Filing date is December 12-19. You may also go to the website below to see a candidate guide for April 4, 2023.


Elections (stephensoncountyil.gov)

Parent-Teacher Conferences

Conferences will be held Wednesday, October 26th from 2:30 pm-7:30pm, and Thursday, October 27th from 2:30 pm- 7:30 pm. No school on October 28th. Please reach out to your child's teacher to begin scheduling a conference time that will work for you. Parent-Teacher conferences give teachers and parents the opportunity to discuss the academic progress, behavior, and social skill development as well as progress towards meeting the grade level benchmarks. Parents have the opportunity to share valuable insights about the child's interest, study skill and homework habits. Together, parents and teachers can work toward making the school year a positive learning experience. The key to a successful conference is preparation-for both the teacher and the parent. Even if the conference is a few weeks away, begin to think about it now. Ask your child what is going well at school and if they have any concerns. Write down questions and prioritize them in case you run short on time. You may want to take notes at the conference, especially if there are things that the teacher asks you to do with your child at home. Remember, the Parent-Teacher Conference is only one way to communicate about your child's progress: notes, phone calls, online through Skyward, and email are also ways to continue to communicate with your child's teacher.

<u>Elementary Homework</u> <u>Helper</u>

Pearl City School will be offering Homework Helper for students in grades 4, 5, and 6 at no cost. This program is available for students to get extra help on an academic subject, work on homework with a teacher present, or get caught up on missing assignments. Students whose grades fall below a passing grade or who are missing assignments will be requested to attend Homework Helper. Homework Helper will be staffed by one of the elementary teachers and will be available on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday after school from 3:15 to 3:45 p.m. If your child is having difficulty completing or needs assistance with homework, please consider Homework Helper.

<u>JH/HS</u> <u>Homework Helper/Study</u> <u>Labs</u>

The Junior High Homework Helper will be offered 4 times per week. Mondays & Wednesdays from 3:15-3:45 in Mr. Maurer's room and Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:15-7:45 in Mrs. Pitt's room.

High School Study Labs are on Mondays-Friday with Mrs. Hamilton. The time for this is at 7:15-7:45am.

These are great opportunities for students to get extra help on things they may be struggling with.

Ensuring Reading and Math Success Through "Well Checks" with AIMSweb Benchmarks Grades K-6

As our children grow, most of us see charts. Our doctors weigh our children and measure how tall they are. This chart shows where our child stands compared to other children and how fast they are growing. These charts help doctors to understand if our children are growing properly or if something may be wrong, enabling them to do something to help as soon as possible.

Doctors use children's height and weight as "Well Checks", or vital signs of development. We all know how important it is for our children to "grow" in reading as well. In fact, successfully learning to read at an early age is probably one of the most important factors in a child's learning, both inside and outside of school.

Because reading and reading growth are so important, on a regular basis, our school is going to give you "Well Check" information indicating how well your child is reading. We now know what the goals of the reading "Well Checks" should be, and will give this information to you three times per year. Generally, the first "Well Check" was given within the first few weeks of school.

The reading "Well Checks" are simple and accurate. We will have your child read 3 stories from passages comparable to their grade level and we will count the words they read correctly, as well as how well they read the stories. The "Well Checks" take less than 5 minutes. We like to think of it as taking your child's reading temperature.

Teachers will use these "Well Checks" to help them plan their reading instruction. This information will also help them individualize for students who are above or below average in their reading abilities. The "Well Check" information for your child will be put on a chart, and your child's teacher will explain it to you at conference time.

In Winter, your child's teacher will do another "Well Check" to see if an improvement in your child's reading ability has been made. This chart will indicate what your child's score was in the fall and what your child's score is in Winter.

These reading "Well Checks" will be done again during the last several weeks of school (Spring). We will then be able to inform you of how much reading growth your child has made throughout the year, and what may be needed in order for your child to become a truly successful reader.

As a school staff, we are excited about our ability to know where all of our students are at on their path to being successful readers and learners. We hope that you are excited as well. We also look forward to seeing and talking with you regarding the progress of your child.
