### **School Board Elections**

On April 4, 2023, residents of our community have the opportunity to elect three members to the Board of Education. There are five candidates running for the three open seats. In alphabetical order they are Tracy Downs, Jace Kempel, Tim Pauley, Richard Sargent, Nicole Sheffey. To help inform our community, profiles/bios have been placed on our website and included below.

### **Tracy Downs**

Thank you for the opportunity to introduce myself. I am Tracy Downs and I have been a resident of Pearl City since 2002. I grew up on a farm and attended kindergarten through 12th grade in Scales Mound where I graduated high school before attending Highland Community College and Loras College, in Dubuque, Iowa. I received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Finance from Loras in 1998 and began a career in banking that summer. In 2001, I was hired at German American State Bank in German Valley and began looking for a smaller community to buy a home and raise a family. I currently have three children in the Pearl City school district: my oldest son, Jayden, is a junior, my daughter, Kameron, is a freshman, and my youngest son, Clayton, is in 8th grade. They all started at the Pearl City daycare at the age of three and we were blessed for the before and after school care they received over the years. Throughout the entire decade in which I have had children in the district I have been involved in activities at school, made a point to meet teachers and principals, and made an effort to be a positive influence on the district.

### **5 Essentials Survey**

Beginning January 24, 2023 and running through March 31, 2023, all parents, certified teachers and students in grades 4-12 are asked to participate in a short survey on school climate and learning conditions. The State Board of Education requires all Illinois schools to participate in the Illinois 5 Essentials Survey to guide local and state improvement initiatives.

The parent survey is to be completed by parents, guardians, or other caregivers with a child in grades prekindergarten through 12. The parent survey is available in English and Spanish and takes approximately 10 minutes to complete. If you have more than 1 child and they attend the same school, you may elect to participate multiple times. Parents with children enrolled in multiple schools may participate in the survey for each school. Only one parent per household may participate in the survey.

Pearl City Schools is asking all parents to take the time to complete the survey. Information collected from the survey provides insight that guides future improvement planning.

## **Spring State Testing**

Spring is in the air and that means the students and teachers are preparing for the State exams. This is the fourth year Illinois has participated in the IAR assessment. The test will be administered to students in grades 3-8. The 2023 exam has a simpler format to improve the testing process while still providing reliable information about student achievement. This year's results will allow parents, teachers, and students to see how the student is growing in his or her knowledge and understanding of the state's learning standards, which are focused on college and career readiness.

Since the Spring of 2020, ISBE requires all public-school students in grade 9 to take the PSAT 8/9 and all public-school students in grade 10 to take the PSAT 10. ISBE will continue to require all public-school students in grade 11 to take the SAT. These tests will again show the school and student areas of strength and areas to improve upon. For the Juniors, the SAT will play an important part in their college acceptance and also scholarship opportunities.

No assessment can ever fully capture the skills and abilities of a great teacher or the extraordinary benefits and positive impact of a great school. These assessments are simply one reflection of your child's academic growth. Assessments help provide a sense of where and how we are succeeding and where and how we must improve, along with other indicators, such as classroom work samples and teacher observations. The IAR and SAT assessments are designed to give schools and teachers more information to support improvement efforts and personalize teaching to better guide our students' learning. These spring assessments correspond with what the students are learning in the classroom and with the performance expectations of the Illinois Learning Standards in English Language Arts and Mathematics.

## **Ways you can help your child with IAR and SAT testing:**

- Offer practice exercises and questions that are similar to those that may be on the test.

- When practicing with your child focus on their weakest areas in order to strengthen this area and to build their confidence when taking the actual test. Please contact your child's teacher for more information.
- Keep practice sessions short and if your child becomes frustrated stop the session.
- Be sure your child gets a good night sleep
- Eat a healthy breakfast
- Share the importance of the exam with your child. This test will help gauge the learning level of your child. Encourage them "To Do Your Best on the Test!"
- Help your child stay calm the day of the test

This program is for those Pearl City graduates who have already successfully completed their first year of college, or trade school program, and will be going into their 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, or 4<sup>th</sup> year as a full-time student.

Since its 2010 inception, the Pearl City Upperclassman program has awarded over 125 scholarships totaling over \$70,000. The program is designed to be perpetual.

Preschool Screening for the 2023-2024 school year will be taking place on Friday, March 17th for any child between the ages of 3-5 and living in the Pearl City School District. Any child who will be three years old before September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, is eligible to screen on March 17th and attend the preschool program next year. Children must be screened in order to be considered for the preschool program.

Preschool screening is a play-based assessment that generally last 45 minutes, and will be held in the preschool classroom (Room 111) at Pearl City Elementary School. During the screening, your child will play in the classroom with a small group of their peers and a variety of professionals (general/special education teacher, Speech and Language Pathologist, PASS Coordinator etc.).

The purpose of this screening is to identify children who would benefit and/or be eligible to attend the preschool program next year, or need additional evaluation and/or services. Space in this program is limited. Children who are not initially enrolled in the program will be placed on a waiting list.

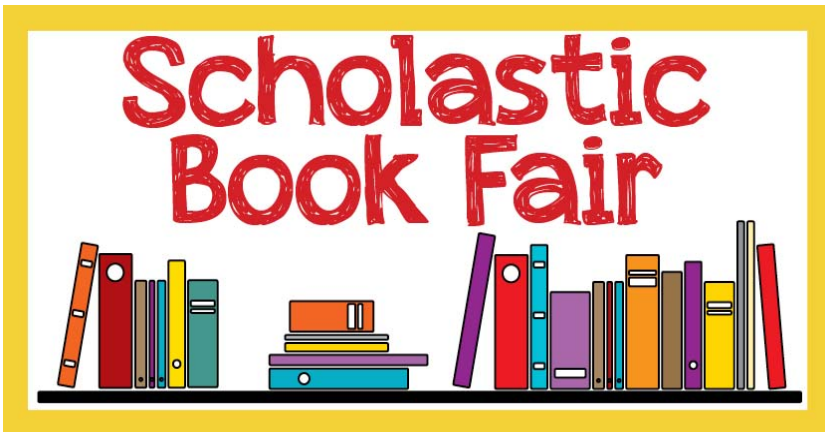
Kindergarten Registration for Fall of 2023-2024 is now open. New Families to Pearl City should use this link to begin the online registration.
