QUALIFICATIONS

Any person who, on the date of election, is a citizen of the United States, of the age of 18 years or over, a resident of the State and the territory encompassing the district for one year preceding the election, and a registered voter is eligible. A member shall not be a child sex offender as defined in Section 11-9.3 of the Criminal Code of 2012 and cannot serve as a school trustee. (105 ILCS 5/10-10)

SIGNATURE REQUIREMENTS

Petitions must be signed by at least 50 qualified voters or 10% of the voters, whichever is less, residing within the district. (105 ILCS 5/9-10)

FILING DATES

December 12-19, 2022 (not more than 113 nor less than 106 days prior to the consolidated election).

WHERE TO FILE

With the county clerk or the county board of election commissioners, as the case may be, of the county in which the principal office of the school district is located. (165 ILCS 5/9-10)

TERM

4 years (may be changed to 6 years by referendum). (105 ILCS 5/9-5)

If reapportionment is required under 9-22 of the school code, the members are divided into two groups, with terms of 4 years and 2 years or 2 years and 4 years.

TERM BEGINS

Within 40 days after the election, (105 ILCS 5/10-16)

RESOLUTION TO EFFECT ABATEMENT OF WORKING CASH FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board") of Pearl City Community Unit School District 200, Stephenson County, Illinois (the "School District") has heretofore created and established a Working Cash Fund (the "Fund" or "Fund 70") in and for the School District, pursuant to Article 20 of *The School Code*, 105 ILCS 5/20-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, Section 20-10 of *The School Code* authorizes the Board to abate the Fund at any time, upon the adoption of a resolution so providing, and to direct the transfer of moneys in the Fund to any fund or funds of the School District most in need of the funds being transferred, provided that the School District maintains an amount to the credit of the Working Cash Fund (including the amount of any taxes levied for working cash purposes pursuant to § 20-3 of *The School Code* and not yet collected, and amounts transferred pursuant to § 20-4 of *The School Code* from the Fund to other funds of the School District as loans repayable to the Fund), at least equal to 0.05% of the equalized assessed valuation of taxable property in the School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined and does hereby determine that it is necessary and in the best interests of the School District that the Working Cash Fund be abated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Pearl City Community School District 200, Stephenson County, Illinois, as follows:

- <u>Section 1</u>. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds and determines that the recitals contained in the preambles to this Resolution are true and correct, and hereby incorporates them into this Resolution by reference.
- Section 2. Abatement Amount. The Working Cash Fund of the School District shall be abated in accordance with § 20-10 of *The School Code* as of the date hereof by the amount of One hundred fifty eight thousand five hundred seventy seven and No/100ths Dollars (\$158577.00) (the "Abatement Amount").
- <u>Section 3.</u> Transfer to Capital Projects Fund. The School Treasurer of the School District is hereby authorized and directed to forthwith transfer the Abatement Amount from the Working Cash Fund (Fund 70) to the Capital Projects Fund for projects completed in FY22.

Section 4. Additional Findings. The Board hereby finds and determines that the Abatement Amount, when added to the Capital Projects Fund of the School District and without regard to any subsequent transfers of the Abatement Amount, will not result in an excessive accumulation of assets in the Capital Projects Fund and further, that the balance of the Working Cash Fund will, after the permanent transfer authorized in Section 3 above, be equal to at least 0.05% of the equalized assessed valuation of taxable property in the School District.

Section 5. Outstanding Loans. If necessary to effectuate such abatement and permanent transfer, outstanding loans from the Working Cash Fund to any other funds of the School District in an amount, together with any cash immediately transferred pursuant to Sections 2 and 3 above, equal in the aggregate to the Abatement Amount, shall be paid to the Capital Projects Fund of the School District, and any remaining outstanding loans shall be paid to the Working Cash Fund at the time and in the manner required by *The School Code*.

Section 6. Severability. In the event any provision or provisions of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining provisions hereof.

<u>Section 7.</u> Repealer; Effective Date. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed, and this Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage.

WHEREAS, the aggregate amount of property taxes extended for the bond and interest purposes for 2021 was \$108,087; and it is hereby determined that the estimated amount of taxes to be levied for bond and interest purposes for 2022 is \$106,163.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education, Pearl City Community Unit School District No. 200, Counties of Stephenson, Jo Daviess, and Carroll, State of Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The aggregate amount of taxes estimated to be levied for the year 2021 was \$2,705,092.

Section 2: The aggregate amount of taxes estimated to be levied for the year 2022 does exceed 105% of the taxes extended by district in the year 2021.

Section 3: Public notice shall be given in the <u>The Journal Standard</u>, being a newspaper of general circulation in said district, and a public hearing shall be held, all in the manner and time prescribed in said notice, which notice shall be published not more than 14 days nor less than 7 days prior to said hearing, and shall be not less than 1/8 page in size, with no smaller than twelve (12) point, enclosed in a black border not less than 1/4 inch wide and in substantially the following form:

II. The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for the year 2021 were \$2,705,092.

The proposed corporate and special purpose property taxes to be levied for 2022 are \$2,915,923. This represents a 8.65% increase over the previous year.

III. The property taxes extended for debt service and public building commission leases for 2021 were \$108,087.

The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2022 are \$106,163. This represents a decrease over the previous year.

IV. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2021 were \$2,813,179.

The estimated total property taxes to be levied for 2021 are \$3,022,086 This represents a 8.32% increase over the previous year.
